

PACIFIC COAST CONFERENCE Men's Basketball Supplement

Season

- A. Basketball practice shall begin and end on dates to be in compliance with C.A.C.A. Athletic Code, Chapter 9.02 (Begin October 15th. End 3rd week of February.)
- B. Schedule
1. The maximum number of contests to be in compliance with C.A.C.C. Athletic Code, Chapter 9, Section 9.03 (28) includes scrimmages).
 2. The starting date for contests shall be in compliance with C.A.C.C. Athletic Code, Chapter 9, Section 9.02.
 3. All Conference games will start at 5:00pm or 7:00pm, dressing room available 90 minutes prior to start, and the playing floor is to be available for warm-up practice one hour prior to start of game. If starting time is delayed for an unforeseen reason, and the host college is notified of the emergency, a 30 minute warm-up will be permitted prior to the start of the contest. If doubleheaders are scheduled, start times are 5:00pm and 7:00pm, with a minimum 25 minute warm-up time.
 4. By agreement of both colleges involved, games scheduled for Wednesday or Saturday may be played on other days with advance notice given to the Commissioner and Conference Athletic Directors prior to the beginning of Basketball Season.

Rules

- A. Book – N.C.A.A. Rule Book
- B. Officials
1. Three officials are to be assigned by the Conference Commissioner. In the absence of one official, the contest will be played with the agreement of both teams and the remaining two officials. A substitute official may be obtained if he is a certified member of the Pacific Coast Conference approved official's association.
 2. Official's fee shall be determined by the Conference. If one official fails to appear, the other shall be paid in accordance with the Pacific Coast Conference official's fee schedule.
 3. Home team Athletic Director or designee shall provide the following reliable and competent adults for home basketball games.
 - a. Timer
 - b. Official Scorekeeper
 - c. 35 Second Clock Operator

- C. Equipment
1. Uniforms – Basketball teams playing at home in all Conference games shall wear light colored uniforms. Basketball teams playing away from home shall wear dark colored uniforms.
 2. Basketballs – The home team will supply at least six (6) basketballs for the visiting team. The Spalding TF-1000-ZK-PRO composite wide seamed basketball is the official Conference ball.
 3. Music – Home team has the right to approve music during warm-up.
- D. No member of the Conference may take still, motion pictures, or video tapes of any opponent's game in which that member college is not participating.

Championship

- A. Ties
1. Co-Champion will be declared in case of ties.
 2. For advancement in regional or state playoffs
 - a. The individual conference series between the tied teams shall be first consideration.
 - b. Should a tie remain, the win-loss record against the championship team will be the determining factor.
 - c. Should a time remain, the individual team's won-loss record against the highest finishing team will be used to break the tie.
 - d. If still tied, the individual team's won-loss record against the lowest finishing team will be used to break the tie.
 - e. If a tie still remains the state seeding criteria will be used to resolve the tie.
 - f. If a tie still remains a coin flip with representative and tied team coaches will resolve tie.

All-Conference Team Selection

- A. Selection to be held at a meeting which will occur following the last Conference game. Meeting site and time to be determined by the Conference Representative. Said Representative will chair the meeting.
- B. Selection Procedure
1. Each Conference coach, in college alphabetical order shall nominate any player from his team, and the names, year, and sizes will be listed on a chalkboard.
 2. After listing, each conference coach in reverse alphabetical order shall discuss the merits of the player he has nominated.
 3. A secret ballot vote will be conducted with each college submitting one ballot with the names of 15 players in ranked order from 1-15. A coach may not vote for his own player(s).

4. After tabulating the votes, the top fifteen players make up the All-Conference Team. Any tie(s) which increase the number over the 15 limit will be voted on again until the top fifteen players are chosen.
5. From the top 15, the Athlete of the Year will be selected by secret ballot following the coaches' discussion in alphabetical order of the merits of each player.
6. Honorable Mention – Any player who is nominated and receives a vote but is not selected on the All-Conference team will be announced as Honorable Mention All-Conference.
7. Coach of the Year – A separate vote will be taken for the Coach of the Year.

Awards – (As listed in Pacific Coast Conference By-Laws)

- A. Championship Team Trophy
 - (1) Athlete of the Year
 - (15) Individual awards to Conference Championship Team
 - (15) All-conference Certificates
 - (1) Coach of the Year Award

Basketball Coaches Committee

- A. Conference appointed Sports Representative
 1. Chair and preside at all meetings, non-voting
 2. Membership to include all Conference men's basketball coaches, one vote per college.
